## Stand Firm in Your Faith

I know quite a few people who used to be Christians but have lost their faith. Some of them stopped believing when they went off to college. Their professors said that Christianity was foolish and they didn't want to be known as fools, so they denied Christ. Or classmates told them that the Bible is hateful towards LGBTQ people. They didn't want to be hateful, so they gave up on Christianity. Others started watching YouTube videos that taught that science has disproven God. They didn't want to be anti-scientific, so they abandoned Jesu

s.

Each person left Christianity for different reasons. But they all had this one thing in common. None of them were feeding their faith. None of them were actively going to church and speaking with their pastor and other Christians. Jesus predicted that these people would fall when he told the parable of "The Sower and the Seed." In his story, Jesus compares our faith to a plant. If our faith is not "fed" and "watered," it will dry up or get choked out by the weeds of life. That's why Paul told his congregation in Thessalonica to "stand firm and hold fast to the teachings we passed on to you, whether by word of mouth or by letter." Paul knew that it is not enough to just hear the Word of God once. Followers of Jesus need to actively take hold of it, absorbing Biblical sermons, and meditating on what Paul and the other Biblical authors wrote down.

Wherever you might be in your relationship with the Lord, stand firm in the message of God's love for you in Jesus Christ.

## Mr. Bohl's Classroom Update

The 7/8th graders have been very busy this school year! A few weeks ago the 7/8th graders completed poetry anthologies where they were to compile an anthology of over 25 poems. They also wrote many of their own poems. It is always amazing to see the types of poems that the upper graders find when putting together their anthologies.

Currently, we are going through the book *The Phantom Tollbooth*, a story where our main character is a student who is bored with life and doesn't want to do anything- even though he has plenty of toys and things to do. (Sound like anyone you might know <sup>(G)</sup>) There are plenty of puns and figurative terms from literature that are used literally. Mr. Bohl has been reading it and seems to get a little too much into it if you ask the upper-grade students as there as often many groans from the bad jokes during readings.

In History, we just finished up the Industrial Revolution where we used the History Channel series *The Men Who Built America* to take an up-close look at Andrew Carnegie, John D. Rockefeller, J.P. Morgan, Cornelius Vanderbilt, and Thomas Edison, among others.

In art, the students have been studying street art. We looked at various examples of street art around the world and even many places where you can find it here in San Diego! We talked about what street art means and why it is used. The students were also tasked with giving their thoughts on if it is a good thing or not. They are getting a chance to practice stencil spray paint art of their own! We have not quite finished as of this newsletter, so stay tuned for updates on that!





## **Preschool Information for Summer and Fall 2021**

In order for us to plan ahead and be prepared for your students in the summer and fall, please help us by sharing your plans with us. Often, some students change their schedule for the summer months or take a break from preschool entirely.

If your student will be away from Reformation Preschool for longer than 4 weeks/1 month, please let us know the last day they will attend school and the first day that you are requesting they re-enroll. A \$300 Registration Fee must be paid to re-enroll and return to preschool. As you know, our classrooms have been full and we will give priority to your requests to re-enroll before we accept newly enrolling students. But we must know this request well in advance so that we can best accommodate your child.

A reminder that your child's \$300 registration fee will be due by June 30th, 2021 for the 2021-2022 school year, unless your child will only be here for the summer months (June July, August) then you will be billed \$25 per month registration for those months.
