

Basketball Clinics to Start Soon!



Classroom Update from Mr. Ross and Mrs. Bailey's Classroom

Hello from grades 5-6! As we enter the third trimester, it's important to remember how blessed we are to be in school, learning and growing in God's Word. The students have been busy making the most of their time together. In Religion, Pastor Stone has begun discussing the 7th commandment. As the class talks about the Israelites in Egypt, Mr. Ross is concentrating on helping the students see how Moses and Aaron were representatives of God. They are applying that to their lives to discuss who God's representatives are today. We connect that when we disobey, dishonor, and reject our representatives, we are really dishonoring and rejecting God. We finish by finding ways to love God more so that we treat his representatives with love and kindness.

Last week, grades 5-6 celebrated Pi Day with a Pi extravaganza during math class. Students brought in something edible and circular and spent the class period calculating the radius, diameter, circumference, and area of their treats. After working diligently, they were able to consume their circular goodies! In Science, the class has been exploring gravity, stars and time zones--just in time for Daylight Saving Time! We've just finished learning about Medieval Europe, the Crusades, and the Black Plague in History class. As we wrap up our 27th week of instruction, we've been busy reading short stories, nonfiction articles, learning about nonfiction text features, and will move into our drama unit in April.
