

Message from the Principal: A Free Lunch

Jesus said: "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. Luke 14:26-27





A person would use that phrase to explain that even though a person might receive something for free, it wasn't actually free. Use a lunch as an example—someone had to buy the food, someone had to pay the person who cooked the food. Even when something is given away for free—there is almost always someone who is paying. It just might not be you.

Jesus tells us that there is a cost to following him—a cost to being a believer. Our sin separated us from God and Jesus paid to bring us back to God. He paid for our sin with his life and death on the cross so that we could be believers.

As a believer, Jesus tells us that there may be another cost. Not to save us from sin—Jesus already did that on the cross. But a cost that comes as a result of following Jesus. People may not like us or they may make fun of us—even people that we love like family and friends. People have even been killed because they followed and believed in Jesus! Jesus calls this the "cross" we carry. It is not a cross that saves us, but a cross that we carry because we believe that Jesus is our Savior.

Hopefully, those things don't happen to us—but they might, so Jesus wants us to be ready. He wants us to know that there is a cost to following him. But, as hard or as scary as the cross might be, Jesus is with us. He loves us, he has forgiven us, and he gives us eternal life with him. Knowing that Jesus is always by our side, we can "take up our cross" and follow him.







Uniform Policy Oops Slips

As was noted at Orientation/Meet the Teacher evenings, Reformation will be continuing to enforce our dress code more strictly than in past years. The purpose of our uniform policy is to provide a quality, cohesive environment to our school campus that is conducive to discipline and learning while reducing peer pressure and enhancing school pride. We also believe such a policy can help parents/guardians in getting their children ready for the school day and hopefully save money.

Now that we are a couple of weeks into the school year, I wanted to remind you of our intentions to enforce the policy. You may view the uniform policy in the school handbook or you may come to the office for a printed copy. You may also follow this link for clarification on the acceptable clothing items: www.frenchtoast.com. This may help clarify the type of pants outlined in the policy.

So, after today, teachers may start to hand out "Oops Slips" which is meant as a reminder to adhere to the uniform policy. The Oops Slip will be filled in by the teacher. There will be a 1st warning in which all you will receive is the Oops Slip. The 2nd warning will ask parents/guardians to bring policy-appropriate clothing to school or you may choose to purchase from the gently used inventory of the uniform store (\$2/item). The 3rd warning means that the child will be given policy-appropriate clothing automatically from the gently used inventory of the uniform store and the family will be billed (\$2/item).

Please sign the Oops Slip, to acknowledge that you have received it, and return it to school. If you have questions about this or about the uniform policy in general, you may feel free to ask me. Thank you for working with us in this way.

Homestay families needed!

Reformation has been a part of the international student program for more than 10 years. We have an increased interest in our international student program recently. A Korean international student agency wants to partner with us to send Korean students to Reformation for short-term and long-term enrollment. Short-term students would attend Reformation for a few weeks to a few months. Long-term students would attend Reformation for the entire school year.

Some of these students who are at our school for the short-term and long-term need church members and school families to stay with while they attend Reformation. Reformation Lutheran School needs host families from our church and school who would open their home to an international student.

The homestay families will do everything necessary to care for the child and to make them feel at home while they attend Reformation. Each homestay family will receive \$600 per month to provide for the international student they are hosting.

The homestay families will enjoy sharing their life with the international student and sharing God's Word and love with them in their home.

CLAIREMONT FAMILY DAY - EVENT CANCELLED


